"Jesus then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. He spoke plainly about this." Mark 8:31-32

Easter Means the Words of Jesus Are True

The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead means many things. It means that Jesus is the Son of God, because

only the Son of God could lay down his life, and then take it back again three days later. The resurrection of Jesus means that our sins are forgiven. If Jesus' earthly remains are still lying in a tomb, we have no relief from our sins. But Jesus has risen! Therefore our sins have been erased, thanks to his perfect payment at the cross. In addition, Jesus' resurrection means that we can look forward to our own resurrection. Joined to Christ's death and resurrection in Holy Baptism, we too will rise from death.

The fact of Jesus' resurrection also assures us that Jesus' words are true. Jesus didn't give some vague or ambiguous promise that he would rise from the dead. The Gospels tell us that as he made his way to Jerusalem and the suffering awaiting him there. Jesus three times predicted that he would suffer and die. And each time he predicted his death, Jesus also predicted that he would "after three days rise again." (Mark 8:31) The Evangelist Mark even adds, "He spoke plainly about this." (Mark 8:32)

We don't have to wait years or decades or centuries to find out if what Jesus promised about his resurrection is true. After three days, we know. He either spoke the truth or what he said was false and wrong. When we see Jesus walking and talking with the Emmaus disciples (Luke 24), we know his words are true. When we see him appear to his disciples on Easter evening and again a week later, we can be certain that Jesus speaks the truth. He said he'd rise on the third day and he did exactly that.

The reliability of the words of Jesus is of immense (cont.)

(Led by Pastor Schlicht and Pastor Mueller.)


Lent by Candlelight will be held Tuesday,
